

The Truth About Canada's 2019 Election

PART 1: IMMIGRATION

Immigration

- ▶ Canada has one of the highest per-capita immigration rates in the world - three *times* higher than the United States.
- ▶ Almost 22% of Canadians are foreign-born – almost twice the American total (even if you include illegal aliens.)
- ▶ Ottawa plans to further *increase* the number of immigrants.
- ▶ Two million immigrants came to Canada in the last decade alone. Canada takes 3.1% of the total number of immigrants in the world.
- ▶ "68% of Canadian respondents said minorities should be doing more to fit in with mainstream society instead of keeping their own customs and languages. Moreover, 79% of respondents said Canada's immigration and refugee policies should 'give priority to Canada's own economic and workforce needs' rather than giving 'priority to people in crisis abroad.'"
- ▶ "the difference between the taxes paid and services consumed by the average recent immigrant equals about \$6,000 annually. Given the total number of these immigrants, the annual fiscal burden on Canadian taxpayers comes to about \$30 billion."
- ▶ Immigration increases profits to employers at the expense of workers; immigration causes a decrease to the annual income of labour = \$40 billion; the gain to employers is \$43.5 billion.

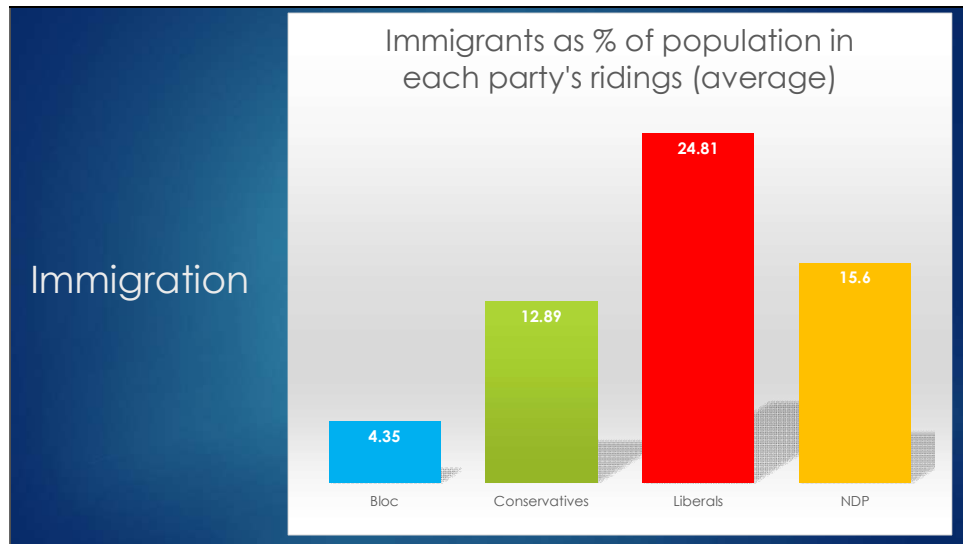
Immigration

- ▶ 2015: 41% of Canadians believe that their country lets in too many members of visible minorities.
- ▶ 46% feel that the overall number of immigrants is too large. The data shows the number of citizens critical of immigration to be on a marked rise since 2005.
- ▶ *The approach [to build] a multicultural [society] and to live side-by-side and to enjoy each other...has failed, utterly failed.*
 - ▶ Angela Merkel, German chancellor, speech in October 2010
- ▶ In 2015 election, the Liberals won 29 "majority-minority" ridings; the Conservatives won two!
- ▶ Residents of the 184 Liberal ridings are more likely to be new Canadians — about one in four were born outside Canada. (The Canadian average is about 22%)
- ▶ Of the 10 Canadian ridings with the highest percentage of immigrants, eight voted Liberal.
- ▶ Of the 30 Canadian ridings whose populations are more than 50 per cent immigrants, all but four voted Liberal.

Laws

- ▶ Until Prime Minister Justin Trudeau passed Bill C-76, a Canadian citizen living in another country could not vote if they had lived outside of Canada for more than five years.
- ▶ Now, any of the 2.8 million Canadians living abroad can cast their ballot based on their last place of residence in Canada.
- ▶ Maryam Monsef, the minister for democratic institutions, has introduced legislation that will allow voters to use the voter information card as valid ID to cast a ballot – no photo ID.
- ▶ Syrian refugees who arrived in Canada in 2015 are now citizens in time for 2019 federal election.
- ▶ Global News report on a Syrian voter: "As a newcomer, Mhana says immigration policy is important to her when deciding who to vote for. She hopes whoever forms the next government will continue to welcome those seeking a better life."
- ▶ "This election I'm really concerned about the rise of the People's Party of Canada which is publicly running against immigration," she said.

Immigration

- ▶ Net cost of immigration into Canada: Up to \$35 Billion per year as of about 10 years ago.
- ▶ Now probably at least \$40 Billion per year.
- ▶ The lower figure (\$35 Billion) amounts to **\$95,890,000** per day.
- ▶ Total Foreign Nationals Remaining in Canada Per Year : over 1.5 million, which includes:
 - ▶ 340,000 Immigrants in the Economic & Family Class
 - ▶ 500,000 to 700,000 International Students
 - ▶ 150,000 to 200,000 Temporary Foreign Workers
 - ▶ 50,000 to 60,000 Illegal Border Crossers
 - ▶ 250,000 International Mobility Workers.
- ▶ According to our Canada Border Services Agency, a total of 100,000 Illegals Entered Canada in 2017-2018.
- ▶ According to projections, another 50,000 will enter in 2019.

Immigration

- ▶ Half of Canadians (49%) say that the 2018 target of 310,000 immigrants is too high.
- ▶ 30% see that number as about right, while the rest say it is either too low (6%) or are unsure (14%).
- ▶ Past Liberal and NDP voters are far more inclined to say that levels are "about right" (41% and 35% respectively) than 2015 Conservative voters – two-thirds of whom (67%) say immigration should be reduced.
- ▶ At **least** four-in-ten who voted for each of the three main parties in 2015 say immigration levels should be reduced.
- ▶ Educational attainment appears to be a factor in views about immigration levels. Those with a high school education or less are nearly twice as likely as university educated Canadians to say that levels should be reduced (59% to 32%).
- ▶ In 1970, when the immigration gates were open to everyone around the world, the population of Canada was 97% European. The rest included the Amerindians and the few non-White immigrants.

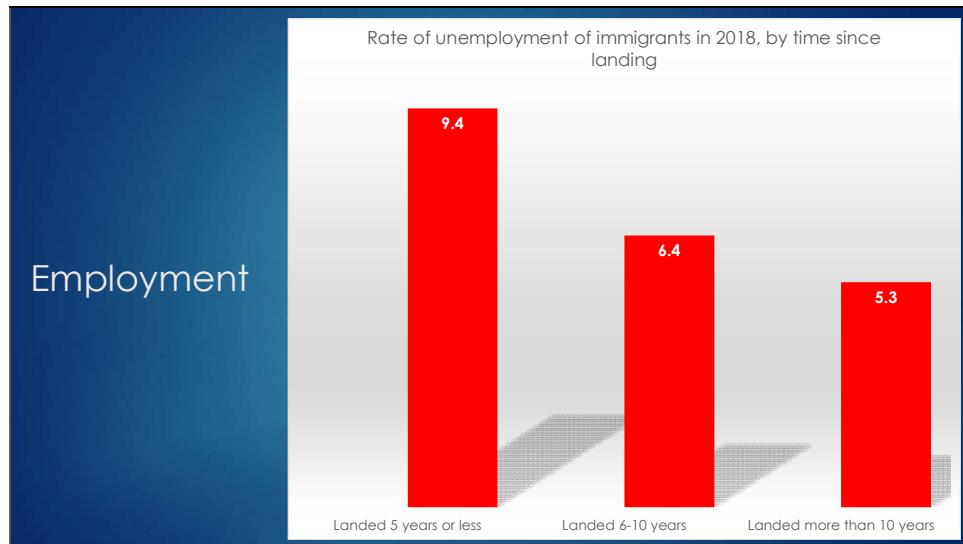
Immigration – TAP-ON / TAP-OFF

- ▶ Before 1990, Canada never had a period of prolonged high immigrant intake like the one it has had since 1990.
- ▶ Since 1990, Canada has had an average yearly intake of close to 250,000 immigrants.
- ▶ Before, there was a "TAP-ON and TAP-OFF" policy.
- ▶ This phrase meant that when Canada faced labour shortages, it turned the immigration tap on to satisfy the needs of employers.
- ▶ When Canada had an excess of labour, it turned the immigration tap down or off to protect its unemployed (1930s).
- ▶ After 1990, the "TAP-ON and TAP-OFF" policy was abandoned.
- ▶ As a result, Canada's immigration levels became an abnormality in Canada's immigration history.
- ▶ In the fall of 1990, Canada's immigration Minister Barbara MacDougall and her Progressive Conservative colleagues decided to increase immigration levels to 250,000.
- ▶ They hoped to woo recent immigrants. By increasing immigration, they hoped to compete with the Liberal Party for "the immigrant vote".

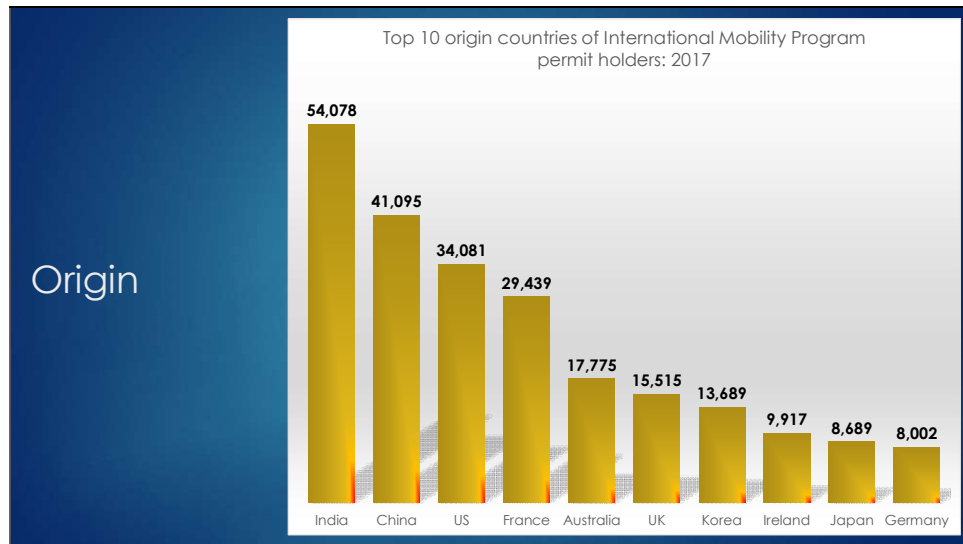

Immigration

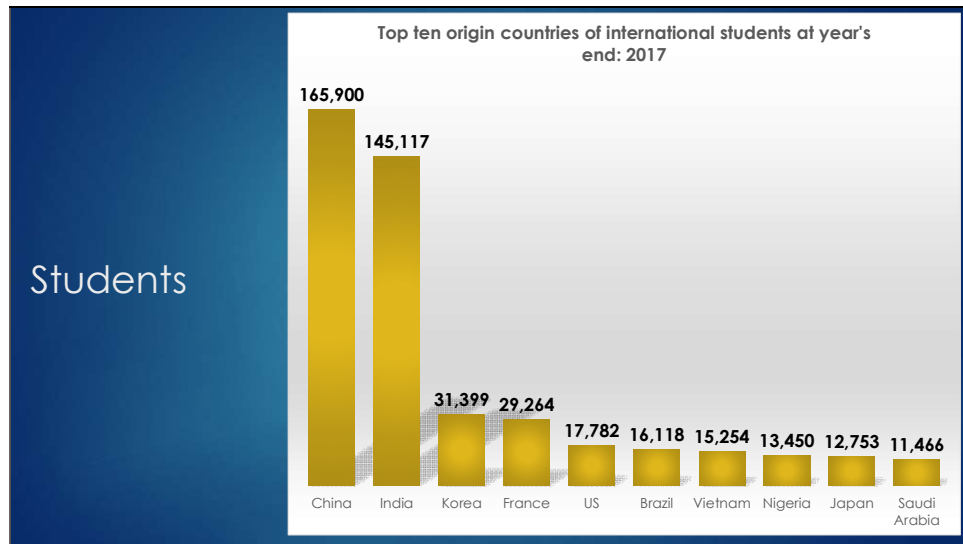
- ▶ Does Canada have a widespread worker shortage?
- ▶ Canada continues to have almost 2 million people unemployed.
- ▶ In the last recession, close to 500,000 Canadians lost good-paying jobs – yet Canada continued to import 250,000 immigrants annually.
- ▶ Ottawa has never asked Canadians if they want 250,000+ immigrants every single year – of if white Canadians are enthusiastic about becoming a minority in the country they built
- ▶ If Ottawa only consults with the immigration industry, the people whom it calls "Canada's immigration stakeholders."
 - ▶ Existing immigrants, leftists, employers, socialists, Marxists, churches...

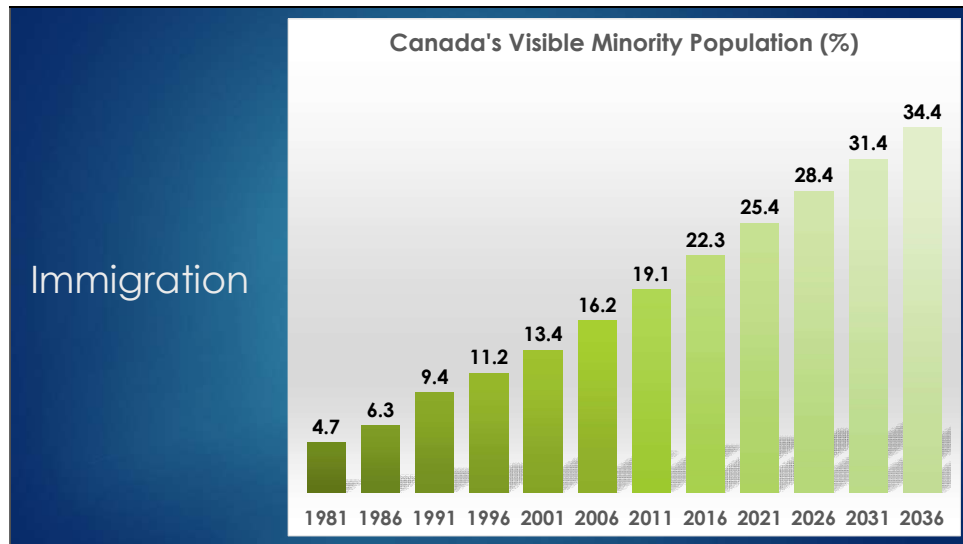

Immigration

- ▶ Canada accepts over 1 MILLION foreign nationals per year.
- ▶ Almost all of them have the potential to become Canadian Citizens.
- ▶ This is far above the 320,000 number that Trudeau pretends to talk about.
- ▶ The International Mobility program is another version of Canada's Temporary Foreign Worker program.
- ▶ However, it has less stringent requirements, making it easier for foreigners (especially younger ones) to get into Canada.
- ▶ According to Vancouver Sun Columnist Douglas Todd, the number of temporary foreign workers arriving each year has *doubled* in the past ten years – increasing particularly after the federal Liberal government was elected in 2015.
- ▶ According to Workers at the World Bank, Remittances sent 'back home' by Temporary Foreign and Immigrants in Canada total \$40 Billion a year.
- ▶ Due to massive immigration numbers, Canada had the highest per capita remittance rate in the entire world... (2013)
